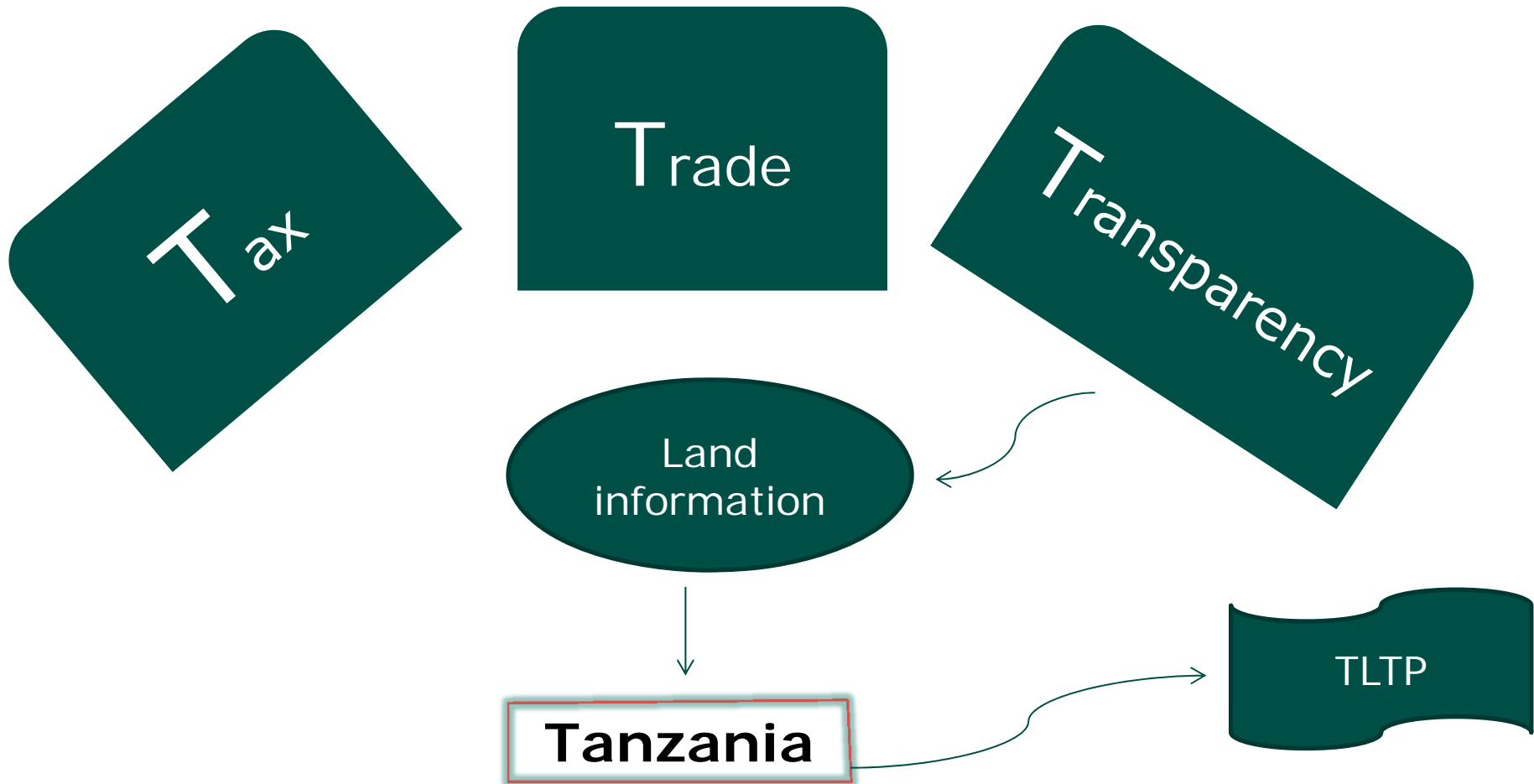

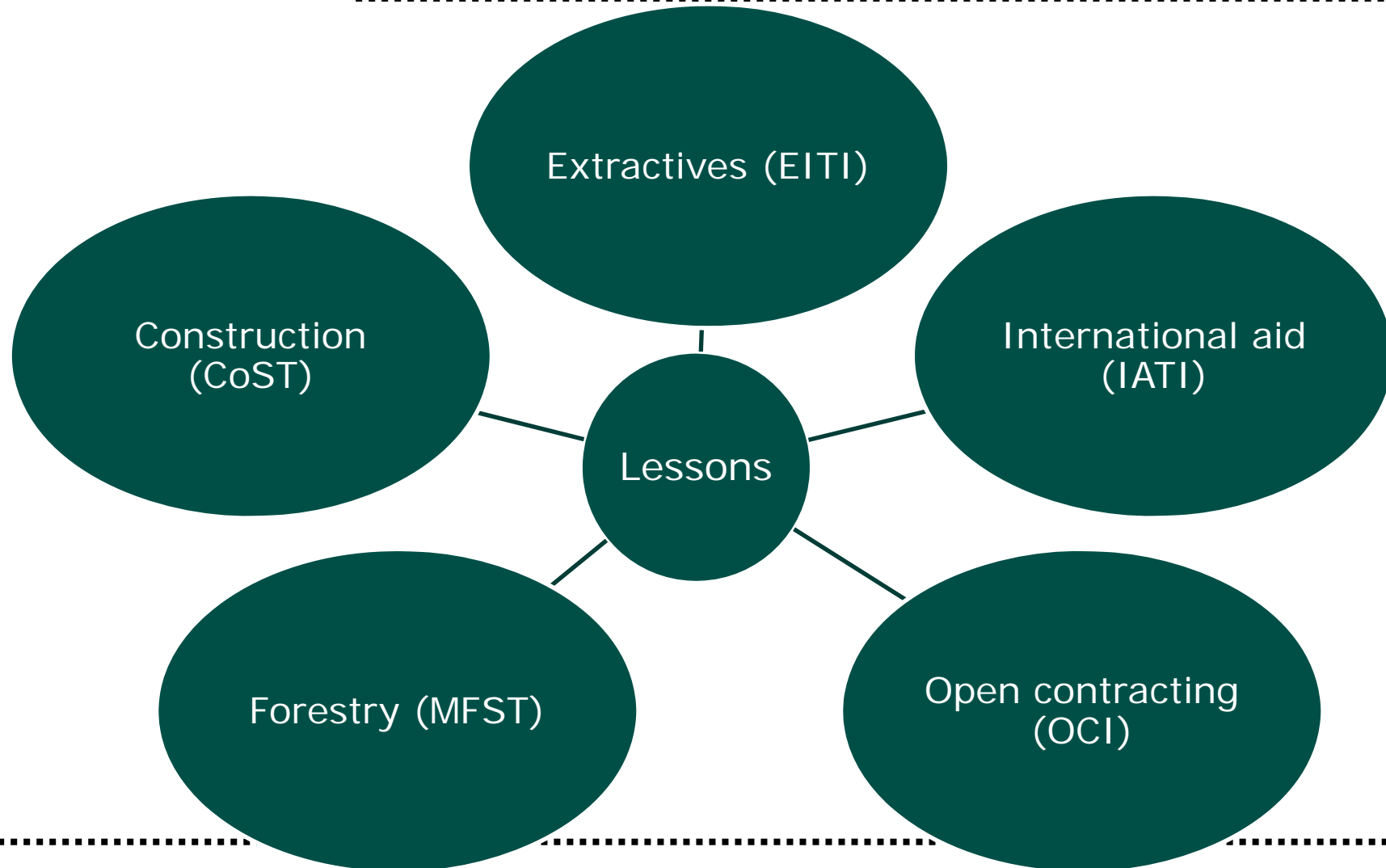

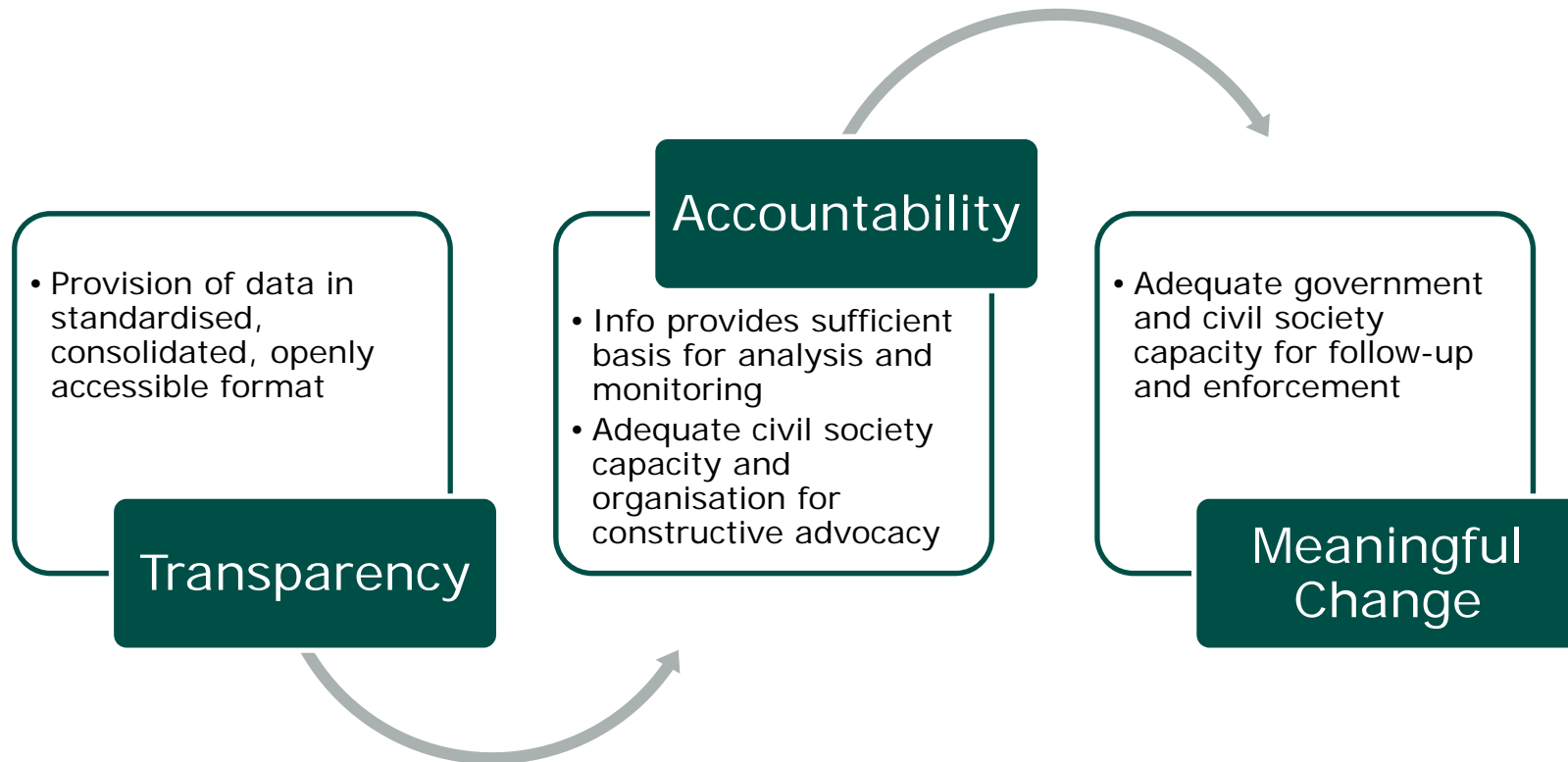
Review of transparency initiatives

Underlying Conditions for Transformative Transparency



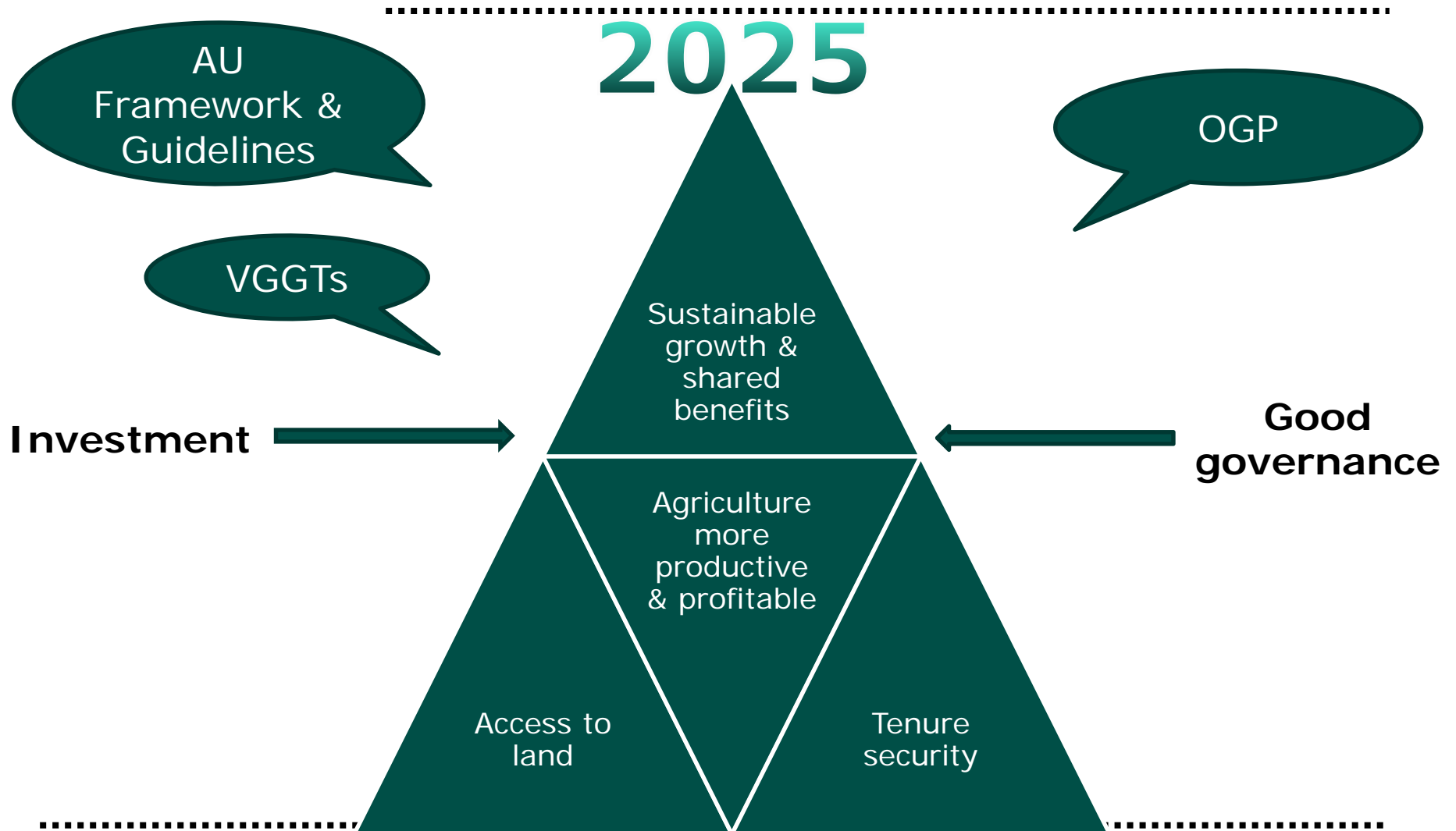


Process needs to be underpinned by:

- **Meaningful consultation and participation** to build consensus for transformative change and define the desired end
- **Clear indicators of success** and a **monitoring** system established from the start but with flexibility to adapt to gauge whether aim has been met
- A **clear institutional structure** set up with distinct roles and mandates at international and national levels

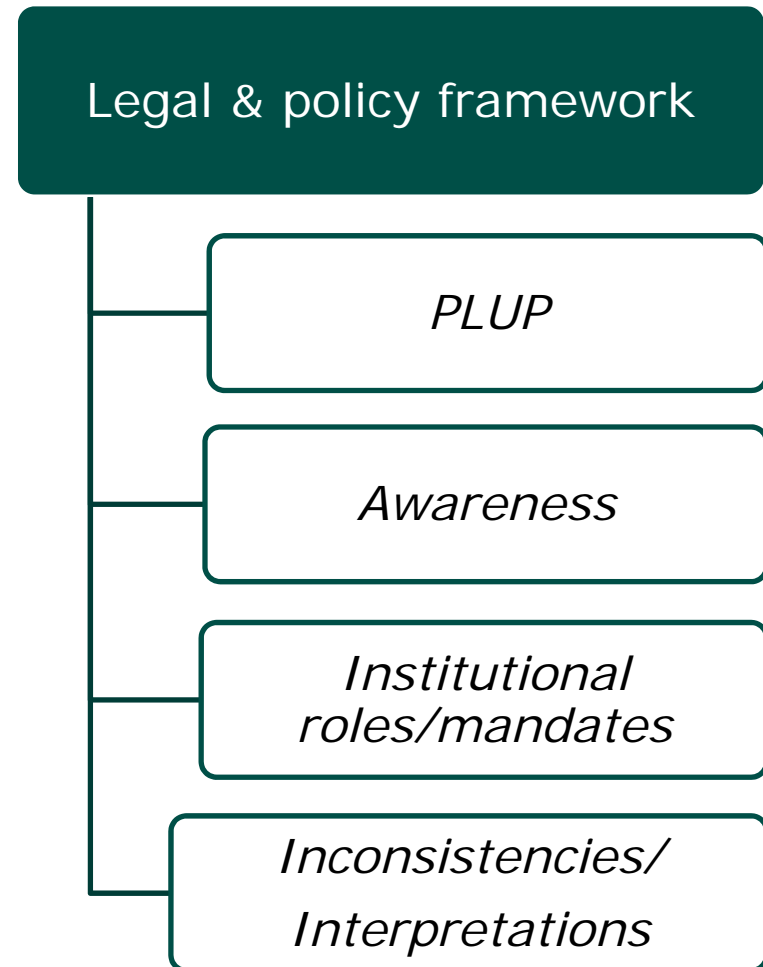
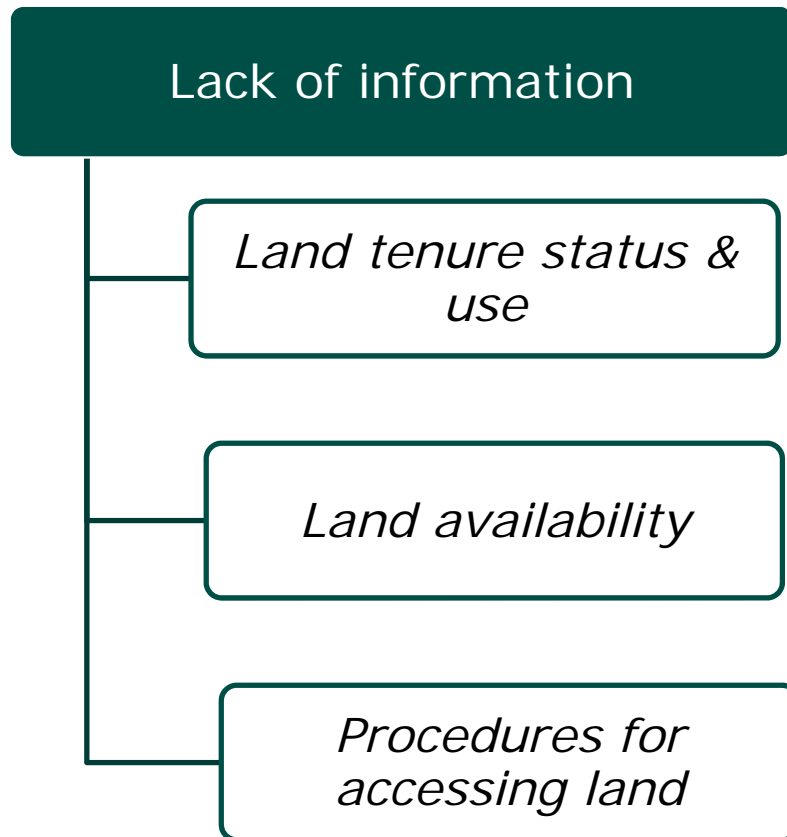
