## Context....

- 1.5 billion people live in conflict-affected and fragile states.
- These countries are furthest away from achieving the **MDGs**.
- No fragile state will achieve a single MDG target by 2015 – **new targets are needed for the unique challenges faced by fragile states.**
- 30% of ODA is spent in these contexts, but results and value for money are hard to show.
- Business as usual in fragile states is **NO LONGER an OPTION !**

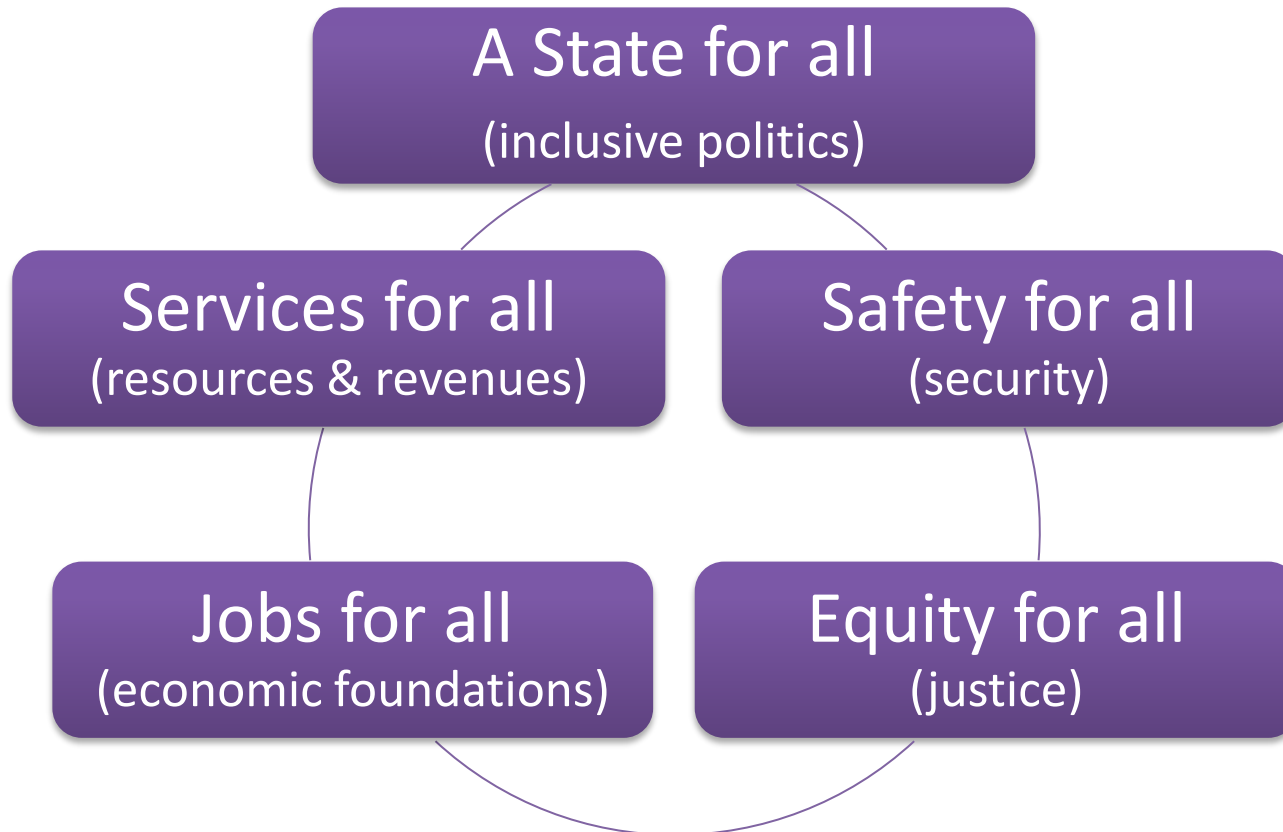

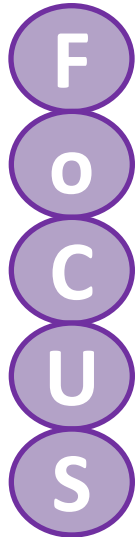




**The Peacebuilding and Statebuilding Goals (PSGs) are the foundations needed to achieve the MDGs**

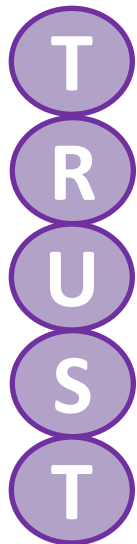

(Heavy at Country Level – Light at Global Level) based on the Proposed Global Partnership for Development Effectiveness presented in Paris last week.
- Implementation of commitments in selected g7+ countries (2012-2015)
- Propose the PSGs in the UNGA in 2012
- Political Commitment from Leaders and Development Partners (scale up their work and apply in fragile states)
